

What we are proposing to make this stretch of the highway safer

We want to make the 47km section of State Highway 5, beginning at Wairakei in the south through to the SH5/SH38 intersection at Rainbow Mountain in the north, safer for everyone who uses it. This project is part of the Government's Safe Roads and Roadsides programme which aims to prevent 900 people dying and being seriously injured on rural state highways over the next six years.
